Scholarships Available

Vernon Electric Cooperative is pleased to announce that scholarship applications are now open for students whose parent(s) or legal guardian(s) are VEC members. Selected high school seniors will each receive a \$1,000 scholarship to use at the college or university of their choice.

In addition to our traditional awards, we also offer a \$1,000 Line Worker Scholarship and a \$1,000 Non-Traditional Scholarship for members pursuing education outside of the standard high school-to-college path.

These scholarships are funded through unclaimed capital credit checks which are are turned over to the Federated Youth Foundation (FYF). FYF, a nonprofit organization that administers trust

funds on behalf of Wisconsin cooperatives, including electric co-ops, makes this funding available to support educational opportunities for VEC members.



Eligible applicants from each participating high school, along with one at-large applicant, will be selected through a random drawing conducted at the January Board Meeting from all completed and verified applications received.
